CURRICULUM

Advanced Placement is available in 13 courses: Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Computer Science, English Language, English Literature, European History, Physics I, Physics II, Probability & Statistics, Studio Art, US Government & Politics, US History

Honors level is available in 27 courses: English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, World Language, Pre-Engineering, Biotechnology and Computer Science courses.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Required for graduation are 26 credits. These include: 4 English, 4 Mathematics, 3 Science, 3 Social Studies, 1 ICT, 1 Fine Art, 1 Physical Education, 1 Health and 8 Elective credits.

The student's average and rank are computed by using the final grade in academic subjects.

Honors programs:

These advanced programs are demanding and require a significant amount of original, independent study.

Standard programs:

These mainstream academic programs are intended to provide students with a college preparatory curriculum. Standard A designation indicates an increased level of academic challenge, while a Standard B designation indicates a less rigorous program.

Supported programs:

Courses in our supported programming are designed to provide learning structures to increase student competencies needed for the transition to further education and job training.

BLOCK SCHEDULE

Starting the 1998-99 school year, Milford High School changed to a 4 X 4 block schedule. As a result the typical schedule consists of 4 courses each semester, each 90 minutes in length. Exceptions may include a combination of 45-minute “half-blocks” and/or extended day programming. Students earn one credit for each 90-minute block. It is possible to earn up to 9 credits in a year.

We have made every attempt to balance students’ schedules, however, a senior might not have an important academic class until second semester of their senior year. Students are not able to choose which semester they take their courses.
