
MHS Counselor News

RECENT AND UPCOMING ACTIVITIES

Grade 9-"Choices Program": School Counselors and the Career Development Specialist collaborate via Wellness classes to conduct career surveys/career exploration utilizing the "Career Cruising" program. Through this program students focus on their interest, abilities, and learning styles. This exercise helps to better inform students regarding course selection for subsequent years via the CPPOS's (Career Pathway Plan of Study) located on the Student Services section of the school web site.

Grade 9 - Universal Screening: This year Milford High School is initiating a universal screening program in the ninth grade related to the use of alcohol, marijuana and other substances. The goal of this program is to let the student know that we are available to reinforce healthy decisions and to assist them in obtaining support if needed for substance use related problems.

The school social worker and school nurse will be administering the survey during Health and Wellness classes. The screening is voluntary and parents will be asked to provide their consent for their child to participate. Parents should expect to receive detailed information about the program within the next month.

Grade 10-Career Research Workshops: School Counselors and the Career Development Specialist continue career exploration exercises through the English 10 classes. Utilizing a program called "Kuder Navigator", students continue their career exploration, allowing them to further discern interests, abilities and values in relation to future career and post-secondary plans. The Career Development Specialist conducts follow-up activities to engage students in further research on identified careers. The resultant research is often utilized by English teachers in the form of a formal writing assignment.

ASVAB: ASVAB to be offered at MHS - March 16, 2017

Milford High School facilitates offering the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) test to any sophomore, junior or senior student who is interested in seeking more information regarding career interests and abilities. This test is offered at the high school and is proctored by trained military personnel. The ASVAB is a multiple-aptitude battery that measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success in the military or other career fields. Students who wish to participate in the ASVAB may be interested in a future career with the military, however the test is offered to all students seeking more information about their skill sets and abilities. Taking this is optional and all results are private unless students seeking a military program wish to share their scores for enlistment purposes. Interested students should contact their school counselor by March 6, 2017.


Grade 11 - College Planning Presentation: Recently school counselors met with the junior class to talk about the college application process. Students were provided a packet of information with a checklist and calendar to help guide them along. Also included were handouts related to SAT, ACT, The Common Application, as well as guidelines for students to request letters of recommendation. We recommend that students communicate with their parents/guardians as well as their school counselor on a regular basis. We are here to help every step of the way and are happy to answer any question big or small.

PSAT Results for Juniors and participating Sophomores: The PSAT was administered to the junior class and sophomores who elected to participate in October 2016. Scores were released via email in December. The College Board recommends students and families, "Think of PSAT/NMSQT and PSAT 10 score reports as roadmaps. They show what you're doing well, and what you should work on to get ready for the SAT — and for college." The PSAT score report has a link to Khan Academy (studentscores.collegeboard.org) for personalized practice of the skills needed to improve.

Grade 11 - State Standardized Testing - SAT - April 5, 2017: The New Hampshire Statewide high school assessment is the College Board's SAT and all juniors will take the SAT on Wednesday, April 5th, 2017 during the school day. The SAT will cover English language arts (reading, writing) and mathematics and will be at no cost for every 11th grade student. The state-sponsored test will not include the SAT Essay, which is optional, but students who want to take the SAT Essay can arrange to do so (see school counselor for more information).
